SELECTING A GENERAL EDUCATION ELECTIVE


As an engineering student you will need to take **one** course for each of the following **5 General Education Electives,** which are to be completed in no specific order by the time you graduate.

- Understanding the Creative Arts



Advanced Search

Go to my.uic.edu, login using your Netid and password and select XE Registration to search for currently available courses for a specific General Education Elective or ALL Electives. Note this menu is completely customizable and you may need to scroll down to find the XE Registration portlet.



Next select **Register for Classes** or **Browse Classes** either option will be able to run an Advanced Search. However, we recommend selecting **Register for Classes** to enable you to register immediately if you find a class that fits your schedule and has limited seats.


